

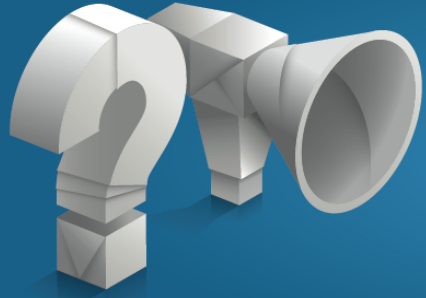

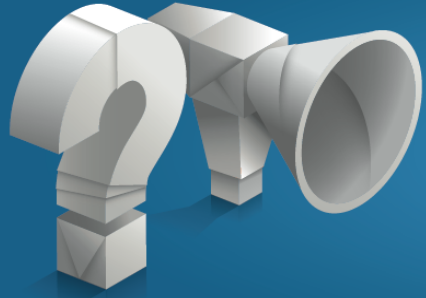

RECENT REPORTS ON THE EU LANDSCAPE

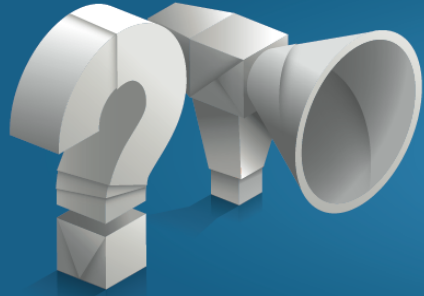
- ❑ information is difficult to understand

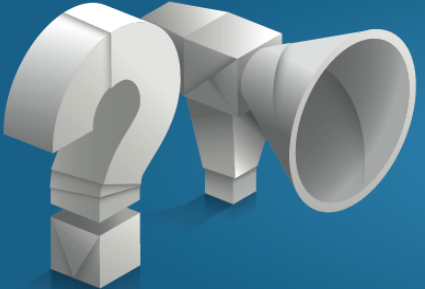
ANYONE CAN BE A VICTIM OF CRIME

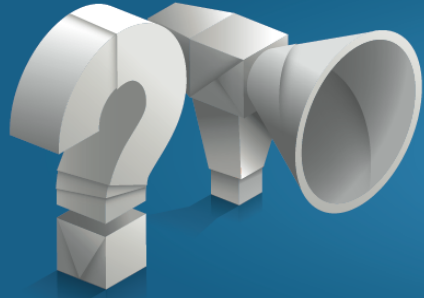

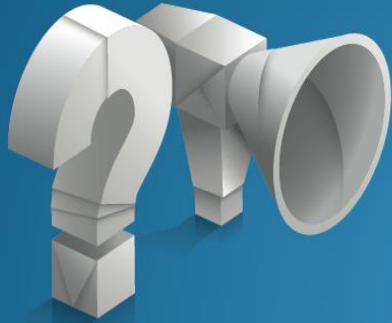
