31 December 2021 - VSE position overview

1- Income:

Total VSE income (approved grants and contracts) for 2021 is €1,158,794, which represents 31 % increase compared to €881,519 income from 2020.

The main reason for this increase is that in 2021, VSE started the Estonian Project (AREV) and larger income the contract of EU Centre of Expertise.

The EU Centre of Expertise amount is the VSE share in 2021.



2- Expenditure:

Total VSE expenditure at the end of 2021 is anticipated to be € 1,081,604, which represents a 31% increase compared to € 828,584 in 2020:

Member should note that in 2021, a range of activities could not be carried out under the operating grant due to Covid-19 related restrictions. VSE adapted to the circumstances and used some of the unspent funds to carry out different activities e.g. development of training platform. And to increase the capacity of some events e.g. Autumn conference, Center of Excellence, Staff exchange.

Based on the current income and expenditure, we have a Surplus of 77,190 euros in 2021.

3- Reserves:

- Level of reserves on 31st December 2020 was € 222,377
- Level of reserves on 31st December 2021 is € 299,567 (this represents an 34.7% increase in our reserves from 2020).

To better explain the implications of VSE's reserve size, Members are reminded that VSE committed to move towards a reserve level of €223,500. This level was based on an estimate of reserves needed to continue VSE operations for 6 months at gradually reducing levels of staffing. VSE set a 2021 aim to achieve this reserves level.

However, this is based on VSE having no identified immediate income. In reality, The EU Commission has approved our new framework partnership agreement for operating grant for the next 4 years and VSE has won BeneVict project for 2022/2023 and EUCVT bridge contract.

This places VSE in a much safer position than anticipated, though of course there are always risks.

4- Income:

Total VSE income (approved grants and contracts) for 2022 is €1,329,399, which represents 15 % increase compared to €1,158,794 income from 2021.

Based on the current income and expenditure as anticipated, we will have a Surplus of 28,614 euros in 2022.

6- Reserves:

- Level of reserves on 31st December 2021 was € 299,567
- Level of reserves on 31st December 2022 is € 320,701 (this represents an 7% increase in our reserves from 2021).

VSE has succeeded to increase the level of the reserves in 2020/2021/2022 which allowed us to reach the level of the reserves of €223,500 which has been set up in 2019 to be reached in 2021, with increase of 44% of that level.

However, with the growth of VSE (Number of staff, number of projects, the total income and expenditures), VSE needs to review the reserve policy and set up a new level of reserves in the coming 24 months to keep VSE in the safe place and avoid any risk in the future.
