the need of external affairs offices and embassies to recognize the problem of victims abroad.



The internacional framework of support of victims abroad has to change:

- Foreigner or external affairs offices and embassies should be informed about (internacional) rights of victims
- they should be trained on victims abroad needs, beside the administrative issues, like passport lost, visas or help in flights
- beside victim abroad needs, embassy staff should also be trained in psychological first aid.
