31 December 2022 - VSE position overview

1- Income:

Total VSE income (approved grants and contracts) for 2022 is €2,123,333.98, which represents an 83 % increase compared to €1,158,794 income from 2021.

2- Expenditure:

Total VSE expenditure at the end of 2022 is € 2,234,544.59 which represents a 107% increase compared to € 1,081,604 in 2021:

Costs were split between the projects and grants mentioned above, costs not covered by grants e.g. paying for conference speakers not in the EU, coverage for fraud.

Based on the current income and expenditure as anticipated, we will have a deficit of € 111,211 in 2022. The majority of that loss being associated with fraud.

This significant loss reduced our reserves to € 233,770.00.

3- Reserves:

- Level of reserves on 31st December 2021 was € 344,980.16.
- Level of reserves on 31st December 2022 is € 233,770.00 (this represents a 35% decrease in our reserves from 2021).

Whilst the decrease is significant, from a financial security perspective it remains above the agreed target for reserves of €223,000. However, that target was set several years ago and needs to be reviewed given the increase in VSE turnover and liabilities. The Board will revise this target in 2024 including a schedule for it to be achieved.
